CREVAA

(Collaborative Response to Elder and Vulnerable Adult Abuse)

Services and support for elder and vulnerable-adult victims of crime. Referrals taken from APS, judicial officials, and law enforcement.

SNAP Outreach

(Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program/formerly Food Stamps)

SNAP application assistance in person or by phone, as well as community promotion and outreach.

Volunteer Senior Transportation (MyRide TN)

Connecting approved volunteer drivers with older adults requesting standard or door-through-door rides through a subscription-based booking service. Pilot programs initially available in Johnson County, TN and Jonesborough, TN.

Options for Community Living

Through FTAAAD

Options provides support services to older adults and those with disabilities who do not access services through another program. Options helps individuals with functional limitations to remain at home through services like personal care, home-delivered meals, and homemaker services.

CHOICES

CHOICES is TennCare's program for long-term care services and supports for elderly or physically-disabled individuals that need help with things like bathing, getting around their home, preparing meals, or doing household chores. If program requirements are met, services can be provided in a nursing home or in the community. FTAAAD is the single point of entry to apply for CHOICES.

Nutrition Programs

Congregate meals are offered five days a week at 16 meal sites around the eight-county service area. Contributions are encouraged, but not required. Call your local senior center to find the nearest site. Home-delivered meals are delivered five days a week to individuals who have been assessed and qualified for the service. Call FTAAAD's I&A line for more information on this program.

Transportation

Round trips from home to senior centers, and/or other stops at local grocery stores, etc. Contact your senior center at least 24 hours in advance.

Legal Services

Legal advice and representation are available to help adults 60 and older secure and maintain public benefits, and resolve problems and situations that require the assistance of an attorney.

Evidence-Based Wellness Programs

Free six-week workshops designed to help participants take better control of their health and improve quality of life. Courses include Living Well with Chronic Conditions, Taking Charge of Your Diabetes, and Powerful Tools for Caregivers.

Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP)

Local volunteers educate Medicare beneficiaries on ways to take an active role in the detection, prevention and reporting of healthcare errors, fraud and abuse.

Long-Term Care Ombudsman

The ombudsman serves as advocate for residents of long-term care facilities, and helps resolve issues and complaints against these facilities, as well as ensuring that residents' rights and benefits are protected.
